SPECIAL RULES & REGULATIONS FOR DIVISION J:

1. Cut flowers should be brought in **large, weighted and unlabeled bottles.**
2. Premiums will not be awarded to INFERIOR specimens.
3. All entries must be in **PRESENTABLE** condition when brought in.
4. The Superintendents reserve the right to removed unsightly flowers.
5. If there is only one entry in a lot, the judge reserves the right to withhold any premium money.
6. Because of the judging schedule, **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED**

Champion Exhibits in Division J - Plants and Flowers will receive special awards by local businesses.

Class 1: Cut Flowers:

- Please enter the stated number of flowers.
- Please provide your own container for the cut flowers, a smaller bottle for small specimens and a larger bottle for larger specimens.
- Please weight down the large bottles.
- For Lots that state blooms, buds are not allowed.
- For Lots that state stems, buds are allowed.
- Foliage can be used but must not be under water.
- Flowers should be uniform and same color in a lot.

Only natural, fresh flowers will be accepted unless otherwise stated. Flowers, container and the arrangement will ALL be considered in the judging. **NO POTS WITH SOIL**

Class 200: Youth ages 12 -18:

Class 300: Children under 12:

1. Children under 12 only may enter.
2. Enter your exhibit in Division J, Class 300 and the specified lot.
3. Premiums and rules will be the same as for amateurs.

Class 400: Professional:

1. This special class is being provided for certified judges and professional arrangers. ***IE Those*** who sell their arrangements or are employed professionally in flower work.
2. Greenhouse flowers may be used in this class if you wish, but they will not necessarily be given preference over garden flowers.
3. Only professionals as defined above may enter.
4. Enter your exhibit in Division J, Class 400 and the specified lot.
5. Premiums and rules will be the same as for amateurs.

Class 600: Handicapped/Confined

1. Handicapped/confined only may enter this class.
2. Enter your exhibit under Division J, Class 600 and the specified lot.
3. Premiums and rules will be the same as for the amateur category.
