DIVISION J: PLANTS AND FLOWERS

Groups 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 600, 700 & 800 may enter in this division

1. Cut flowers should be brought in ***large, weighted and unlabeled bottles.***
2. All entries must be in **PRESENTABLE** condition when brought in.
3. The Superintendents reserve the right to remove unsightly flowers.
4. No endangered species or flowers to be used
5. Identify any plant or flower with name and variety

Class 1 Cut Flowers

- *Enter the stated number of flowers.*
- *Provide your own clean, plain container*
- *Please weigh down large bottles.*
- *For lots that state blooms - buds are not allowed.*
- *For lots that state stems - buds are allowed.*
- *Foliage can be used but cannot be under water.*
- *Flowers should be uniform & same color in a lot.*
- *Entry cannot be added to "Not listed above, identified" lots if a duplicate of another lot*

Only natural, fresh flowers (NO ENDANGERED SPECIES OR FLOWERS TO BE USED IN THE ARRANGEMENTS) will be accepted unless otherwise stated. Flowers, container and the arrangement will ALL be considered in the judging. *NO POTS WITH SOIL. Greens can be added to the arrangements.*

- Lot 157. Perfect in Pink:
Use only variations of color pink
- 158. The Color Palette:
Use many different colors
- 159. First Frost:
Use only white flowers
- 160. Life's A Peach:
Use only peach colors
- 161. Veggie Platter:
Add 2 kinds of "flowering" vegetables to an arrangement
- 162. Bunches of Blue:
Use shades of blue
- 163. Lilies, Lilies Everywhere:
An arrangement featuring lilies
- 164. Celebrate July Birth Flower:
Use 3 stalks of delphinium (July Birthflower) in an arrangement
